WATER.

To Water Consumers.

THE scarcity of water in City

Creek and the increasing de-

mand for water for irrigation, re-

nder the strict enforcement of the

following provisions of the "Ordi-

nance in relation to the Salt Lake

City Water Works," etc., absolute-

ly necessary:

SEC. 10.—Sprinklers for lawns,

gardens, yards, and sidewalks must

be used only for the purposes ex-

pressed in the license, and no

sprinkler shall be used for sprin-

gling the street outside of the side-

walk, unless such privilege is in-

cluded in the license and paid for

accordingly. Sidewalks, windows

and fronts shall not be sprinkled

except between the hours of 8 and

9 a.m., 1 and 2 p.m. and 8 and 9

p.m. No nozzle for sprinkling shall

be larger than one-fourth inch in

diameter.

Water consumers are not allowed

to waste any water, or allow it to

be wasted; nor to use it for any pur-

pose not stated in their license; nor

to allow unlicensed persons to draw

water from the pipes for irrigating

purposes.

Persons having licenses permit-

ting them to sprinkle the sidewalk

in front of their premises must con-

fine such sprinkling solely to the

premises named in the license.

Every water taker should read

his license and not use the water

for any purpose except as therein

stated, as any infringement of the

Water Ordinance subjects the offe-

nder to forfeiture of water privileges

or to a fine of not exceeding \$50

The Orangemen—The Riot.

MONTREAL, 12.—Poor police regu-

lations are generally blamed for

the trouble, to-day. The Orangemen

who pledged themselves not to

parade were openly intimidated

by roughs and loafers, who early

took their places in the streets

armed with weapons and foul

words. Both parties expected and

were prepared for the worst. The

Orangemen went quietly to church

this morning, but it was rumored

that they would bring the police

to bayonet. A large crowd of

harmless union jack, and crowds

hurried to Knox Church in anti-

cipation of that. Inside the church

agendas and orange lilies were com-

mon.

An eye-witness says, at about

1.30 o'clock shouts attracted the

crowd to Craig Street, where a

young man in gray clothes, was

flushing away from the mob. While

the leaders attempted to pull him

off the steps of Dunn's

store, another young man attempt-

ed to aid him, and was struck by a

member of the mob, whereupon he

fired several shots, and simultane-

ously received the fire of the mob.

One shot struck him in the fore-

head, when he fell, bleeding, on the

sidewalk, but shots were still

fired at him, and nobody went to

his assistance until the policemen

placed him on a stretcher, washed

and took him away. A Protestant

clergyman, who attempted to offer
