With one exception they all fell into the ranks, and even Coi. Bowle, who was dying, had his cot carried to the line. The man who declined to enter the ranks, that night made his escape through the Mexican line. That afternoon Santa Ana held a council of war, and against the advice of his best officers, detern ined to storm the Alamo the next morning. During the night the Mexican army fortified, and at the first light of dawn on that memorable Sanday morning its bugles sounded the fatal peal. With a rush like tigers springing on their prey the men dashed forward, but the heroic Texans, roused to their last duty by the sound of the terrible duquelo (the Mexican bugle call for 'Death, no quarter') ringing in their ears, every one was at his post, and so well did they do their duty that twice has brutal hosts of Santa Ana were hurled back defeated, only to be again forced forward by the sabers of the Mexican cavaity. Then Santa Ana himself urged forward his troops. Gen. Castillion's division, after half an hour's desperate fishting, and after repeated repulses and unheard of losses, succeed in effecting an antrance in the upper part of the Alamo, in a sort of outwork. 
