

BIG HORSE RACE MEET THIS MONTH

Manager W. S. Jones Working Hard for This Six Days' Racing.

FAST HORSES ARE COMING

From All Over the Western Racing Association Circuit—Big Thing For Local Horsemen.

Horsemen of Salt Lake have their eyes focused on the 24th day of this month, Pioneer day, when the much-talked-of six days' race meets opens. It will undoubtedly be the biggest thing in turf affairs that ever occurred in Salt Lake, and that the track will be heavily patronized there can be no doubt.

Manager W. S. Jones is working like a Trojan to make the meet a complete success in every particular, and judging by the size of his staff and the money he has to spend to predict that his efforts will result in all that could be expected. He is doing his best to get all the fastest horses here from the western association circuit. He has engaged a large sum of money for that purpose and practically all the fast ones will be here to race for the liberal purses offered.

The meet begins on the afternoon of the 24th, and will continue for six days. Day after day there will be between nine and twelve events, including heats, and running races.

Said a prominent horseman to the "News" this morning:

"I think all local lovers of the sport realize the real importance of the big meet we are soon to have, but they will wait until the first day's events are over with. You know we have some prettily turned out horses in the west, and I am sure that the fastest bunch of racers, trotters and runners local race fans have ever seen."

The horses now racing at Denver are already entered for the Salt Lake meet. For instance, will come Strange and Dewey. Then there is Billie S., Nedra, Dave Boland, Prince Brutus and Ishamia. The names of these fast animals are well known to spectators giving an account of the Denver races.

With such a string of fast ones, and with others coming from California and Idaho, besides the speedsters already mentioned, it is very likely that we will have the fastest bunch of racers, trotters and runners local race fans have ever seen.
