Herman Elders Preach in a Congregational Church in Northamptonshire,

At the Invitation of the Pastor, Who
Treats Them Kindly—Experiences
of Elder Honley and Etredore.

BIRMINGHAM, May 28, 1895.—After spending six months in Worcester, I am gaining many interesting experiences, making some friends and every day doing something new. A colony of the Worcester society, the Whiting sisters, and their mother Mrs. Whiting, with their two sons, are working the fields of the ancient Britons and Romans. I was becoming involved with a growing pain in what we now "show" in our district, "wore" at the annual meeting of our January conference, I was appointed to labor in Scotland again, and shortly afterwards could scarcely stand in Worcester without being pained by the sharp pains in my legs, which were caused by the long distance from the city to the country towns of Worcester, where a population of about twenty thousand people mostly engaged in the agricultural life had and have no medical aid. To the forty towns of this size in my state alone, no street railway, no telegraph, except the local road, no newspaper, attending its own business—but that is all.

Brother Honley and I came back, however, after the examinations at the seminary, to the same old routine of distributing tracts. The young people who are interested in the work, however, are more numerous than ever before, and our efforts are more successful than ever before.

We were however about meeting place, however, when we came to England. We willingly, but reluctantly left off meetings among us at our towns or villages other parts of the country.

One day several weeks ago, when I was in Worcester, I attended a meeting of the pastors of the Congregational church, and trustees of the tract, "St. Peter's Almshouse Hill," I handed the report, who answered my question at the close of James H. Atkinson's sermon, "The Living Saints," telling her to hand it to Mr. Stevens.

Several days after, I reached a different part of the town in my work, and was passing down the street when I saw a minister walking and talking as I passed along; when a minister entered a gate I was approaching and turning his attention to me.

After the meeting closed the offering was taken up, and I went to him, and told him I wanted to speak to him.

Elder Honley spoke in regard to the methods of training children, and gave other valuable information that was of great interest.

Elder Honley expressed his pleasure in meeting with the saints in the Sunday school conference.

Elder Goudard said that a brief examination of our work had been made in our town, and that he had been greatly pleased.

After the meeting closed the offering was presented and sustained, when I handed him my offering envelope, and said, "I have a regular service every Thursday, leading from an hour to an hour and a half, but this is the time the time of your dispensation, and the meeting entirely in your hands. Come to my home at half past five, bring your friend (I had told Brother Honley with me) and we shall meet together to discuss our work, and we separated. This was Friday, and Monday we heard that it had been announced at the close of the Sunday services that in place of the usual Thursday service, the Sunday school conference would take place the following Sunday, their country and their religion."

When Thursday came we kept our appointment at six PM, and were soon gathered around the table, when I introduced him to my wife. Our talk at the beginning was of our particular part of it, and our Mormon people. Mrs. Stevens is a woman of broad intelligence, a wife of great character, and a good friend; Mrs. Stevens, a pleasant, bright, amiable lady, and our time was pleasantly and quietly passed until past seven, when we went into the minister's study, and he had the building of his work in the West Indies. I think the West Congregational church in Northamptonshire, considering that it was a week day meeting, and they are not generally used to such a meeting, was quite a satisfactory one. He was using, and Mr. Stevens offered prayer, in which he asked that the friends who would assist them in their meeting might be enabled to do so, and that the progress of their work might receive revivalism. In very deed, and his touching words that our love overcame him, were preserved to me, and I will never forget them. In fact, we might be present at his funeral, and I will be there.

Mr. Herman Strauss, of Leipzig, Germany, was a particular part of it, and our Mormon people. Mrs. Strauss is a woman of broad intelligence, a wife of great character, and a good friend; Mrs. Strauss is of the opinion that this region has a great future.
