

# TELEGRAPHIC. ABOUT VENEZUELA.

The Boundary Dispute Discussed by European Papers.

BRITISH ULTRAMATURITY DELIVERED.

A Fresh View of the Military Strength of the United States—English Courier.

London, Dec. 10.—A dispatch to the Times from Caracas says: "The British ultimatum has been delivered, but the ministers are reticent as to its contents."
