Double taxes will have to be paid on all the personal property. In the first place, the state of New Jersev will ex-act 5 per cent on the whole of this valuation, as the executors have to give an account of this to the state. Second, each state has laws providing that no stock will be transferred from the name 7216. of a deceased person on the stock books of a corporation unless a tax is paid on it. In some siztes this tax is high. In this way the holdings will be taxed twice, as most of the stock is in com-panies outside of New Jersey. This tax alone will deplete the state by fully 1500,000. Nearly \$4,500,000 of the fortune is invested in the stocks of railroads and various other industrial corpora-
