

Report of the Committee of Ten.—Its Creation; Alma Personnel and Recommendations.—Young, Lathrop, Clark.—Graduates From High School Students.—Prof. W. M. Stewart's Maxims.

At the meeting of the National Council of Juvenile and Criminal Justice at Lincoln in 1930, a committee appointed at a previous meeting made a valuable report through their chairman, Prof. James H. Baker, then principal of the Denver Home School, but now president of the University of Colorado. The duty assigned this committee was to make a report concerning delinquency in excess of study

The same committee was organized and was authorized to produce a report during the meeting of the national council in 1992, the conference to consist of representatives of institutions in different parts of the country. 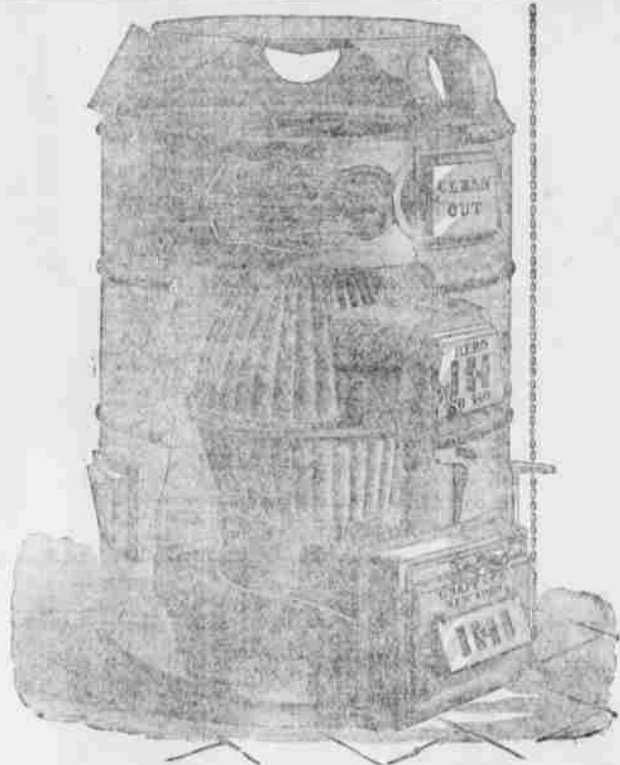
