Decides Nevada Northern Must Build Freight Depot at Ely.

The first decision handed down by the Nevada railroad commission was that the Nevada Northern Railroad company should crect a freight depot at Ely instead of maintaining it at Ely City, a mile or more away. The opinion was written by Chairman Bar-tille of the commission, and covers the situation thoroughly.

The order provides that on or before May 1, 1998, the Nevada Northern May 1, 1998, the Nevada Northern shall begin the construction of a de-pot at FIY. The building must have at heast 1.800 feet of floor space to accommodate the freight and also 1,090 feet of sidetrack at the place.
