Since the arrival of the Union Pacific, which has returned from New York, brings news to the effect that the New York capitalists intend to build another bridge across the Missouri at this point to be used for railroad trains, teams and foot passengers, the subscription list being headed by Frank Smith with \$50,000, he having large property interests here. It is to be a low bridge with a draw for boats, and will be located north of the Union Pacific bridge. It is said that the bridge will be completed by August next, and it is anticipated that it will be built in the interest of the Chicago, St. Paul and Omaha Railroad. It will probably bring the Walwash Railway into this city as a terminal point.

Criminal Carelessness.
Last Saturday afternoon John Davis, a postal clerk at the Union Pacific, forgot to mail some letters dropped in his car, and putting them in his pocket carried them home, forgetting to put them in the post office as he should have done. That night his house was burglarized and his clothes, with the letters, were stolen. The letters were found in the street next morning, all having been opened but the contents were taken. Chinese Telegraph Line.

CHICAGO, 24.—*Tribune's* Washing-
ton: Our consul-general at Shang-
hai has informed the Department of
State that the Emperor of China
has given to the viceroy at Tientsin,
permission to construct a telegraph
line from Tientsin, to be 1,200 miles
in length. The route will be from
Tientsin to Chukking; thence
along the line of the Grand Canal
to Hankow, and on to Shanghai
to Tientsin. A short line of about
seventy miles will also probably be
constructed by the viceroy at Nan-
king, to connect the capital of his
province with the main one at
Shanghai. The work of setting
the poles and laying the wire will
begin next spring. It is estimated
the enterprise will cost \$300,000.
