And when they were come up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip."--Verses 36-39.

This is what the Apostle means in his epistle to the Romans, where he says:

"Therefore we are buried with him by baptism unto death; that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we al-so should walk in newness of life."----Rom., 6-4.

They were BURIED with him in bap-tism.* There is no sign of a burial in sprinkling, no sign of a burial in pouring, no sign of a burial in making a mark on the forchead with water; bu but when the repentant believer is taken down into the water, as Christ was and as the eunuch was, then he is buried in the liquid grave, he becomes dead to the world, and he is raised up from that grave in the likeness of the resur-rection of Christ; and henceforth he is to be a new creature in Christ Jesus, having been regenerated, or, to use the words of Jesus, "born of the water." Jesus told Nicodemus, as we read in the 3rd chapter of John, 5th verse:
