Colonies wintered on summer stands should be sheltered from cold winds, by straw, fodder, corn stalks, or by being boarded up on the coldest quarter, generally on the north, but in different settlements they have their cold quarter. should be used to put the bees in proper condition for wintering. As soon as freezing weather begins, all stock should have absorbing material over the top of the frames, and when winter sets in, all hives, intended to be wintered in the cellar, house, or ground, should be placed in winter quarters. We find that bees whose hives face the south winter best. Do not close the entrance of the hive entirely, but leave a passage for one bee to pass in out. But if left open large enough for a mouse to enter, they will destroy your bees. Hives should be tipped forward one inch that the moisture may run out. The hives should be kept as dry as possible, to promote warmth and comfort to the bees during the inclemency of the winter.
