LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.
Thermometer 70 degrees F. in the
shade at 1 p.m. to-day. Clear.
Disappearing.—The old Tabernacle
is gradually disappearing before
the efforts of the corps of workmen
engaged in demolishing it.
Postponed.—There will be no
performance at the Theatre this
evening not to-morrow night. In
consequence of the indisposition of
Mr. Aibischer the playing of "Ham-
let" is postponed until Saturday
evening.
Injured.—We regret to learn that
Elder James S. Brown, was thrown
from his wagon several days ago
and badly bruised about the face,
neck and shoulders. His injuries,
however, were not of a serious
character.
Harper's Monthly for October is
full of good things. This magazine
maintains its reputation in the world

Scarce.—Most kinds of fruit are
comparatively scarce this year to
what they have been in past sea-
sons. The yield of plums, apples,
pears, tomatoes, &c., is not nearly
so large as it was last
year, and the prices of those fruits
are proportionately higher.
Passed.—Yesterday Major Wilkes,
of this city, received a dispatch
from his son, Gilbert Wilkes, naval
cadet from Utah, that he had suc-
cessfully passed his final examina-
tion at the United States Naval
Academy, at Annapolis. We join
with the numerous friends of Major
and Mrs. Wilkes in congratulating
them on the success of their son,
who does them and himself credit.
The Dedication.—We surrender
most of our space this evening to
the full report of the proceedings at
Logan, yesterday, which will
prove intensely interesting to the
vast majority of our readers. We
are indebted to Elder George God-
dard for the account of the trip, the
procession, &c., and to Elder Geo.
F. Gibbs, for a verbatim report of
the prayers and addresses.
Brighton Ward.—A new meet-
ing house is in course of erection
in the Pleasant Green district of
Brighton Ward, and materials are
being brought together for another
in a more central location. These
public improvements are being
done by voluntary donations, and
the people manifest considerable
liberality and public spirit, although
but a small community. They sus-
tain the efforts of Bishop Schoen-
feld.
Bear Lake Mechanics.—We are
in receipt of a communication from
Bloomington, Bear Lake Valley.
It is signed Leon, and takes issue
with a former correspondent who
complained of the lack of mechan-
ics in that thriving settlement.
Leon says there are two shoe mak-
ers in Bloomington, who do not
get full work; but have to fill up
their time in farming. The town
needs a blacksmith, but they have
a surplus of carpenters because
when the folks want to build, they
get their plans from a good me-
chanic, then do the work them-
selves or employ inferior workmen.
Leon says the people want others
to settle in that valley, but they do
not want the statement that there
are no mechanics in Bloomington
to go uncontradicted.
Personal.—We were favored this
morning with a call from Mr. Jus-
tus Bien, a New York publisher,
and the proprietor of a large litho-
graphic establishment in that city;
Mr. Simon Wolf, of Washington,
D. C.; and Mr. W. L. Woods, also
of Washington, Secretary of the
House Committee on Public Lands.
These gentlemen are on their way
to the coast, and left by this after-
noon's train for San Francisco.
They have been to Utah before, and
are much interested in the welfare
and progress of Utah. They
recognize the industry, peace and
good order which abound in this
Territory, as indications that the
"Mormons" are a different kind of
people to the lawless community
described by their enemies. We
wish these gentlemen a pleasant
and prosperous journey.
Another Case.—Charles Gilbert,
who was sentenced some time since,
to imprisonment for fifty days, by
Justice Pyper, for petty larceny,
committed in Davis County, and
subsequently released on a writ
of Habeas corpus by Judge
Schaeffer, was before the same
Justice yesterday. The thefts with
which the prisoner was charged
were committed in Weber and Da-
vis Counties, and his counsel, At-
torney Stickland, moved for his re-
lease on the same ground as it was
previously procured—that the of-
fense was committed in another
county to that in which the exam-
ination was being conducted, and
consequently the Court had no
jurisdiction. Justice Pyper, how-
ever, held that whereas that prin-
ciple may be sound as regards a
matter involving the disposal of a
case by trial and judgment, he
held the opinion that such was not
the case in the matter of a prelimi-
nary examination and commitment.
His view was, that the offense
being committed in the judicial
district, and the prisoner property
being found with the prisoner in
this city, his court had jurisdiction,
and he therefore held the prisoner
to answer to the charge.
The counsel for the prisoner
signified his intention of obtaining
a writ of Habeas corpus.
