**THE PARLEY'S CANYON CONTINUED.**

The plaintiffs allege that not only the plans and specifications were changed, but also the route of the conduit, one change alone involving an extra expense of \$50,000. This alteration, it is insisted, was made by the city engineer and board of public works after the contract was let.
