WANTS AN ACCOUNTING.

An action has been commenced in the Second District court by A. R. C. Smith of North Ogden, the well known sheep man, against George W. Atkins, to recover the sum of \$1,000, giving account of the partnership business existing between the two men. The complaint alleges that the plaintiff entered into a partnership business with the defendant in 1892, for the purpose of raising, buying and selling sheep and wool, and that the defendant has used money belonging to the company for his personal use without the consent of plaintiff, and he therefore desires an accounting.
