COL. BRUBACK'S FUNERAL.

Post Mortem Shows Unfortunate Mining Man Struck Head and Fell.

A post mortem examination was held over the remains of the late Col. Bruback Saturday afternoon, by Drs. Bow. er, Steele and Hosmer, at the colonel's late residence. A dislocation of the spinal cord was found between the first and second vertebrae, and severe bruises on the forehead and top of the head. It is believed that Col. Bruback

struck his head against a projecting rock which stunned him so that he lost his hold on the ladder, and fell off. In addition to his life insurance, the de-ceased carried accident policies amounting to \$20,000, and the autopsy was to ascertain whether death was due

to natural causes or accident. An inquest was held at Park City, Sat-urday afternoon before Justice B. M. Sperry. It was shown that the ladder Sperry. Jurisdic-tion is hereby ceded to United States n, to and over any and all lands or territory within this state which have been or may be hereafter acquired by the United States for the purpose of sites for public buildings, of every kind whatever, authorized by act of Con-gress; the state, however, reserving the authority to exacute its process, both criminal and civil, within such terri-

Section 2. Governor to execute ces-The governor is hereby au thorized and empowered to execute all proper conveyances in the cession here. n granted upon the request of the said United States, or proper officers thereof, whenever any land shall have been

acquired for such purpose, The existence of the law was called to Senator Smoot's attention who called on the secretary of war and laid the matter before him. The action of the Legislature was approved by Sec. Taft, and on his receipt of the papers formally deeding the reservation to the gov-ernment, work on the post improve-ments will be resumed.
