

MRS. CHADWICK SCORES A POINT.

Claim of Government that She Had No Money in Oberlin Bank is Disproved.

CARNEGIE MAY NOT TESTIFY.

Will Only be Put on the Stand in Case His Evidence is Needed To Rebut Defense.

Cleveland, March 7.—Nine witnesses were examined in the Chadwick trial today, and the defense established the fact that the claim of the government that Mrs. Chadwick had no money in the Oberlin bank at the time of drawing checks which were certified by Spear and Beckwith was incorrect in two instances at least.

It was shown by the general journal of the bank that on Nov. 3, 1903, when Mrs. Chadwick received a certified check for \$10,000 an entry crediting her with that amount was made on the journal of the bank and a deposit slip for \$10,000 was made out in her name.

It is doubtful if Andrew Carnegie will take the stand. Dist. Atty. Sullivan said this evening.

"It is not my present intention to put Mr. Carnegie on the stand, and I do not think he will be called upon to testify unless his evidence should be needed in rebutting something introduced by the defense."

SAN DOMINGO TREATY TO BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY.

Washington, March 7.—Without determining any question of policy in regard to the Santo Domingo treaty, the senate decided today that the treaty should be reported as soon as possible from the committee on foreign relations, and the entire question fought out in executive session.

The amendments offered in the committee were confined to a reduction of an alleged surplusage of words. They were offered verbally and taken down by a stenographer. They are to be printed and considered when the treaty meets tomorrow.

The prompt action of the foreign relations committee undoubtedly will result in a much earlier decision in the senate. Nearly every senator who discussed the treaty today expressed a desire that the measure be kept from becoming a party question.

A DECISION BY CABLE.

Received in Honolulu from Judge Gear in San Francisco.

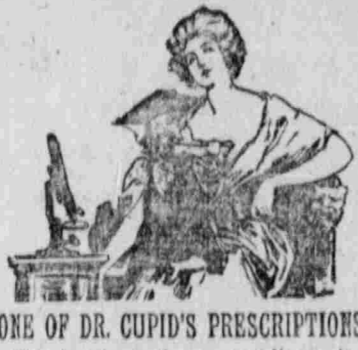

PORTO RICANS.

They Are Eligible to Government Positions.

Washington, March 7.—The court of appeals of the District of Columbia today decided that a Porto Rican in this country possesses the necessary qualifications as to citizenship under the civil service regulations to make him eligible for employment in the government service. The opinion decided the case of Juan Rodriguez, a Porto Rican who applied in February of last year for employment in the Washington navy yard, and who was denied the right of examination by the board of employment of the yard on the ground that he was not a citizen of the United States.

COUNTESS MONTIGNOSO.

Compelled to Give Up Her Villa For Lack of Funds.

Florence, May 7.—The Countess Montignoso (formerly crown princess of Saxony), has been obliged to give up her villa at Papiasovo and has taken rooms in a hotel at Fiesole. The countess states that the change is necessary until her former husband (King Frederick Augustus of Saxony), either voluntarily or by order of the courts, pays her the allowance agreed upon at the time of her divorce.

Strike in Warsaw.

Warsaw, March 7, 10:25 p. m.—The strike in Sosnovice continues in full force. The Saturn coal mine, owned by the richest company in the district, is the only mine working, the men having received an increase of wages such as the owners of other properties say they are unable to concede to their operators.

Murdered His Family.

Danville, Ark., March 7.—James Inco of Whiteley, Ark., confronted with the dead bodies of his wife and three children, the latter ranging in ages from 4 months to 4 years, broke down and confessed that he murdered them, saying that it seemed impossible to make a living for them, hence his action.

New Civil Service Rule.

Washington, March 7.—President Roosevelt has added a new paragraph to rule 3 of the civil service regulations, which permits the appointment or resignation of army officers and supernumeraries of Indian schools without competitive examinations. Such appointments are to be made by the commissioner of Indian affairs, with the approval of the secretary of the interior.

Got Money Under False Pretense.

Portland, Ore., March 7.—Albert A. Condee, publisher of a magazine in Los Angeles, left here tonight in charge of Sheriff W. A. White of that city to answer a charge of fraudulently obtaining many thousands of dollars. It is said that most of the money was squandered on race tracks.

No Increase in Cavalry.

Berlin, March 7.—The government's measure to increase the cavalry by 28 squadrons was rejected by the appropriations committee of the reichstag today, against the earnest protest of War Minister von Einem. The government's increases in the infantry and artillery establishments were granted, but the members of the committee of all parties except the Center party voted.

Missouri Maximum Rate Bill.

Jefferson City, Mo., March 7.—The senate today passed the maximum rate bill by a bare constitutional majority, after amending the measure so it came from the house. The measure reduces the rate on livestock \$1 per car.
