almost a necessity, in some parts, for a person to "announce" himsel before he receives any attention. This should not be. It is all right for citizens to become candidates, either from their own choice or on the advice of friends. It is also right for the people to go outside of these and exercise the choice the uselves. And in naming a legislate r-which effice to not always thankful one-it is commonly the petter way to select persons who are avowedly not candidates, and wh would accept only from a sense o patriotic duty to the State. But in But in any event incompetents and irresporsibles : ught to be guar led against and shut out of the State Legislature. It is a body too important in its function. to be composed of pettifogging lawyers, second rate polit claus & d oyster statesmen. Knowledge, brais an energy of the first order are useded in the State L gi-lature to make it truly representative of the best interests of the people.

## THE LATE GENEBAL CONFERENCE.

The sixty seventh semi-annual Conference of the Church has completed its sessions, and the Saints feel that it has been one of the most important and satisfactory astherings of the kind that has been held. In the instructions, and admonitions, and action taken by the Church authorities the inspiration of the Aimighty has been clearly manifest. When, on the date men-uned, President Young has been july installed as the chief in the First Presidency, he selected Heber C. Kimball and Willard Rouards AB first and second counsel is re-pectivey, and they were also duly set apart, being sustained by the unanimous vote of the Twelve. In their case, as with President Young, no ceremony was omitted.

As to the statements of the partles referred to, and others of a similarly micropresentative nature, all the Elders should have learned by this time that they are characteristic of such individuals. Not all the representatives of the Reorganized courch inruige in such inaccuracies, many of them being bigominded, honorable copie; but there are some in that deomination, as in others, who do not pursue a reputable course. We have this advice to offer to the Eliers respecting such: Treat them picoisely as similar characters in other sectarian decomications are treated, as that is

their true position. With regard to the authority of Presi ent Young or any others of the fweive called by the Lord through he Prophet Joseph Smith to the holy spostleship, or any of their successors, or of the Church, we would remind he Elders of the counsel of the First Presidency in this respect. Such auhority is not a subject on which there is any roum for dount, hence no cocasion exists for discussion thereon by the Eiders of the Courch of Jesus Curist of Latter-day-Saints. The test of such divine autoority is open to all individuals of all sects-by doing the will of the Father and thereby receiving a testimony of the truth. The Eiders preseot the opp rtunity f.r aptLey preach and the ordinances they perform, and the way they perform, and the way is open to every individual who will obey the word of God as taught in deripture to ascertain the truth of the Eisers' message, that the Gospel of Unrist has been restored to earth preparatory for the hour of God's Judg-ment, just as the revelation given to Bt. Joon on the isle of Patmos foreold.
