The Demijohn-Ploche mine, at Ploche Nev., is in a very prosperous condi-tion, reports Manager Owen A. Balley, who is just home from a trip to that property. He brought with him a num-ber of specimens of ore that looked ex-ceedingly good to stockholders of the company as well as to other persons who have seen them, the samples being galena and silver and lead carbonates. The galena carries 311 ounces of silver, \$6.40 gold and 73 per cent lead; while the carbonates average \$4.80 gold, 209 ounces of silver and 555-10 per cent lead. Be in Prosperous Condition.

KING CARLOS' FINANCES

Lisbon, June 8.—The commission which is investigating the finances of the late King Carlos' reign has discov-ered that Dowager Queen Marie Pia re-ceived \$40,000 from the state. The queen dowager does not deny that she received this money, but says that she was justified in using it on the ground that her allowance of \$2,400 a year was not sufficient to maintain her in royal state.
