CORNELIUS TRAVELLER DEAD

Veteran of 83 Closes a Grand and Useful Career.

Richmond, Cache Co., Jan. 13.—Cornelius Traveller, one of our oldest and most respected citizens, passed away on Friday morning, Jan. 13. His death was due to a general breaking down of the system caused by old age. He was 82 years old, having been born on Sept. 29, 1821, in London, England. His father's name was Thomas Traveller and his mother was Jane Moore Traveller. In the year 1840 he married Eliza Atkins; to this union was born three children, Mrs. Mary Ann Cook of Salt Lake City and Mrs. Peter Christensen of Richmond, the third child dying early in youth. He was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on Dec. 11, 1832. His wife died, and on Dec. 25, 1854, he was again married to Miss Francis Hobbs, his present wife, who with her five children survive him. Charles Peterson Held to Answer for Murder Without Bail.

Eureka, Utah Co., Jan. 14.—Timothy O'Day, a pioneer prospector and miner of "Little district," was found dead in bed at the Utah county infirmary Sunday morning, Jan. 10. Mr. O'Day had been suffering from miners' consumption and lead poisoning. Deceased was 54 years of age and was well known and liked by all whom he came in contact. As far as known he leaves no relatives. The remains were buried at Provo.

Emma Almina Alford, the 13-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Alford, died at Mr. Alford's ranch in West Platte on Monday. The remains were shipped to Springville on Wednesday morning by Undertaker Wallace for burial.

HELD WITHOUT BAIL.
The final arguments in the preliminary hearing of Charles Peterson, charged with murder in the first degree, in causing the death of John Eastman and John Backman on Christmas morning, were heard before Judge Thomas C. Burns on Wednesday afternoon and the prisoner was bound over to the district court on the charge without bonds. Efforts will be made to have the charge reduced to manslaughter to a lesser crime so he can secure bail.

HANS DENISEN SUMMONED.
Veteran and Pioneer of 80 Called to His Reward.

Manti, Sanpete County, Jan. 13.—Another pioneer, and one of God's elect, has gone to his reward. This time the summons came to Hans Denisen who died at his home here early this morning after a lingering illness. He was in his eightieth year. Fifty-two years of that time have been passed in Utah. Hans Denisen embraced the Gospel among the first after its introduction in his native land, Denmark, and came to Utah in 1852 with the first company of Saints from that country. Many of his home ever since, although he has been away at different periods engaged notably in the building of temples, having assisted in the construction of three—the St. George, Manti and Salt Lake temples. He was a devoted Latter-day Saint, and devoted the best efforts of his long life to the cause of his conversion to the cause he loved so much.
