cense to Offending Saloon. Special Correspondence. Kaysville, Davis Co., Feb. 4.—The members of the present city council are laying up wrath to come, and they evi-dently do not expect re-election, judg-ing from the way they ignore the peli-tions of the citizens respecting illicit liquor traffic. At its session last night, by a vote of 4 to 1, a local saloon man was given a renewal of his license despite the petition of 93 citizens of Kaysville against granting it, also the protest of Probation Officer A. S. Thompson, and the request of Juvenile Judge Gunnell, to the same effect. From the saloon in question boys of 15 have testified to buying intoxicants. Judge Gunnell, in a formal communication to the city officials, made known the find-ings in his court which led to the con-clusions that the law in relation to the selling of intoxicants to minors had been violated. The probation officer met with the coundil last night ready to submit proof that liquor had been bought by minors from the saloon n question. A motion made to have the saloon keeper appear Feb. 8 was lost, and then the saloon man, who was present, was giv-en the renewal of his license. A criminal action will probably now be taken against the liquor seller. #### CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETY.

An adjourned meeting of the farmers An adjourned meeting of the failable of this district was held in the city pavilion this afternoon to hear the re-port of the committee on constitution and by-laws. A. T. Money of Palinyra, was elected chairman. The report of the committee was accepted and the constitution adopted it was resolved to form a convertion known as the constitution adopted it was resolved to form a corporation known as the "Farmers' Co-operative Society." with a capital of \$50,000, at \$100 per share, payable \$25 at the issuance of the share, and \$10 annually. The president and other officers are to be elected by the shareholders, and alme directors to be elected by the president and officers, three for one year, three for two, and three for three years, thereafter for three years. The object of the society is to trans-act the business of the mombers in buy-ing and selling without the intervention of what is known as middle men.
