

## AN UPRISING IN MANCHURIA.

Rebels Pillaging, Burning and  
Killing Around Mukden.

## INSURGENTS GAIN STRENGTH

Russian Forces Entirely Inefficient  
to Maintain Order—Chinese Troops  
Are No Good.

Victoria, B. C., July 26.—Advice by the steamer Duke of Pife from the coast included details of the rising in Manchuria. Refugees from the affected district are reaching Chefoo and the Japan Mail says they report the whole province of Shen King in a state of insurrection. Rebels are pillaging, burning and killing around Mukden. All the villages and hamlets have been burned and hundreds of the inhabitants who offered resistance have been killed. The Russian forces are entirely inefficient to maintain order in southern Manchuria.

At Antung, in the southeast of Shen King, the insurgents are daily developing strength. They now number several thousand and have possession of Kullen Ching as well as Antung. The effects of the disturbances are felt in Wiju, beyond the Manchurian frontier. The Russian garrison in Fench Wang Tien does not seem to be sufficient to cope with the movement. It is expected that the Chinese insurgents crossed the border into Korea, but were driven back by the Korean troops, the Chinese losing twelve men. The number of men assembled at Antung is some 2,000, and the inhabitants of Wiju are much perturbed, being apprehensive of an eruption across the Yalu. This body of Chinese insurgents are two bodies of insurgents.

Fugitives arriving in Chefoo give very serious accounts of the state of affairs. They represent the whole of Shen King as in a state of unrest, even to the gates of Mukden, and they declare that Russia has not sufficient force to preserve order. The Japanese consul at Chefoo, in his report to the government, states that the pirates who recently appeared along the coast of Shan Tung and Liao Ning were pursued by a Chinese government transport and a number of them were decimated by the Taotai of Chefoo and in consequence the pirates were liberated from piratical depredations. The Russians have dispatched a force from Hai Cheng to attack the insurgents.

New was also received that an organization called the Village Union, Lianchuan Hai, has risen in five districts lying north of the Yalu river. The Chinese government has been notified by the French from Pao Ping have discovered that the insurgents that have their headquarters at Ts Chow number 20,000, mostly armed soldiers and Boxers. They have issued circulars calling upon the three to pay no foreign indemnity.

## RUSSIA WILL FORTIFY.

London, July 27.—A dispatch from Berlin says: Information has been received here that the Russians are building new forts along the Yalu river north of New Chang for the protection of native subjects. The Russians will also fortify certain central places in Manchuria, and there is indication of their withdrawal. The Chinese authorities alone are incapable of suppressing disorder. The Russians are taking Chinese troops, but they prove incompetent.

## SHOT BRITISH WOUNDED

English Lieutenant Tells How Boers Shot Them.

London, July 27.—The Daily Mail publishes Lord Kitchener's official report regarding the Viakfontein affair, which is as follows:

"Last, W. S. R. Duff has given me the following information: On the day after the fight at Viakfontein, May 23, Lieut. Hearn told him that while lying on the ground wounded, he saw about twenty yards from him Lieut. Spring and Sergt. Findlay, both slightly wounded. They were binding up each other's wounds, when a young Boer came up with a rifle and fired at them. Lieut. Hearn said that the Boers thought him dead, contenting themselves with taking his rifle and legging. Lieut. Hearn also said that others of our wounded were not hit by Boers. Several of the men saw a Boer, evidently some one in authority, trying to shoot our wounded."

## PAYMASTER ROBBED.

Manila, July 27.—The robbery of the paymaster's safe at Santa Cruz of \$20,000 yesterday is supposed to have been the work of soldiers. It appears that Maj. Canby, who was staying the night in the Laguna district, left the safe to the guard house, and that while it was there the thieves succeeded in abstracting its contents. Gen. Canby has sent the chief of the Manila detectives to investigate the affair. Chief Paymaster Tower was not apprised of the robbery until informed of it by a representative of the Associated Press.

## PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION.

Systematic Agitation for a Change of Date to be Started.

New York, July 27.—Official steps looking to a systematic agitation for a change of the date of holding the presidential inauguration have been taken, says a special from Washington to the World. Resolutions adopted at the last inaugural committee meeting were laid before the district commissioners with a request for an appropriate action.

It is understood the commissioners are in favor of a date later than March 4 and will bring the matter to the attention of Congress and the governors of the several states and territories.

## MUST RETURN TO WORK.

Order to Chicagoan Molders or Union Men Will Take Their Places.

Chicago, July 26.—Striking iron molders of Chicago have been notified by the officers of the national organization of molders that they must return to work immediately or allow other union molders to take their place. A communication to this effect was received by the local molders from Martin Fox, president of the Iron Molders' Union of North America.

The strikers will consider the matter at their meetings tonight and a mass meeting of the members of the five unions will probably be held tomorrow afternoon to take decisive action in relation to it.

As the local strike was called in defiance of the national officers, a clash may follow the latest order.

The twenty-eight foundries in the city that are members of the National Foundrymen's association will close shop Monday. Union men may be brought in from other towns to fill the places of the strikers if the latter refuse to go to work.

## INURED IN RUNAWAY.

Robert D. Grant and Sister Thrown Out of Buggy.

Miss Elizabeth Grant of Sunbury, Pennsylvania, sister of Robert D. Grant of this city, was thrown from a buggy in a runaway yesterday and severely hurt. She and her brother were out driving behind a very spirited team and were just entering Liberty Park when the animals became unmanageable. They turned north and proceeded at the top of their speed and on reaching Fourth South they dashed into a telephone pole and the two occupants were hurled violently to the ground. Miss Grant struck on her head and was rendered unconscious. It is a marvel that her neck was not broken. She received an ugly cut over one of her eyes, and it was at first thought that the member had been destroyed. She described the accident to the Evening Star. The buggy was badly damaged and several bruises about the body. Judge Barch, who happened to be near the scene, rendered the unfortunate people prompt assistance. A carriage was brought and Miss Grant was taken to her brother's home, where her injuries were attended by Dr. Burroughs. Mr. Grant was hurt about the legs but not seriously. The buggy was demolished.

## WHAT UTAH PAID.

With Idaho and Montana Her Internal Revenues Amounted to \$755,673.

Washington, July 27.—The annual preliminary report of Collector of Internal Revenue Yerkes, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1901, shows that receipts from all sources of internal revenue for the year aggregated \$306,471,992, an increase of \$11,500,000 over 1900. Western states and territories contributed as follows: California and Nevada, \$4,580,478; Hawaii, \$10,182; Montana, Idaho and Utah, \$755,673; New Mexico and Arizona, \$160,508; Oregon, Washington and Alaska, \$1,223,915.
