LOCAL OPTION NOT POSSIBLE

Judge Howell Holds That County Commissioners Cannot Withhold Liquor License.

OGDEN PORTLAND CEMENT CO

Organized for Half Million to Operate Near Brigham City—Woodmen Parade Tonight.

OGDEN, May 3.—According to the decision rendered by Judge Howell of the district court, Utah has no local option law as declared by Gov. Spry in his veto of the liquor measure passed by the last legislature. The case at issue was that against the county commissioners of Morgan county brought by D. A. Smyth, a saloon proprietor at Devil's Slide to compel them to issue a liquor license to him after the county had gone "dry." The court held that the commissioners in failing to issue the license to Smyth failed to assign a good and sufficient cause why the license should not be issued. The court further contends that the issuing of a saloon license is not discretionary with the commissioners if the requirements of the law are complied with by an applicant, such as qualifications of good character, etc.

NEW CEMENT COMPANY.

Baker of Ogden, directors.

BANK WINS SUIT.
