MAKING NO SMOKE.

But Four Furnaces Are In Operation At U. S. Smelter,

The United States smelter at Bing-ham Junction is operating with four furnaces in commission and yet prac-tically no smoke is seen issuing from the top of the high lead stack. Perthe top of the high lead stack. Per-sons going by the plant on the trains have been led to believe that the plant is idle, just as the works of the Bing-ham Consolidated and Utah Consoli-dated are at this time. But such is not the case. The United States smelter is handling approximately 500 tons of ore and fluxing material per day-doing nandling approximately 500 tons of ore and fluxing material per day—doing fully as well as the American Smelting & Refining company at its Murray plant—yet it is making no smoke. Ap-parently, the process installed by the United States company for the con-servation of fumes is a complete suc-cess in every respect

cess in every respect. It is expected that the roasting de-partment of the United States smelter will be in operation before the end of the month.

into a producer of a great deal of importance. "I have never seen a better showing anywhere," said Mr. Parker today, "and while this statement applies particularly to the possessions of the Alta company the district in which they are situated is a splendidly mineralized region. The country is bound to come to the front sconer or later. It will not always be neglected as it has been in the past. On the Alta property the American veln crops prominently and can be traced for a length of 4.500 feet cutting through diabase, granite and porphyry formations. The company has run a tunnel in on the vein for 150 feet and in that distance the average width of the veln is nearly seven feet, two feet of which is something like this." At this point Mr. Parker exhibited an assay certificate showing 1.02 ounces in gold, 174.6 ounces in silver. This ore, Mr. Parker says, is being sacked for shipment, hence it is reasonable to presume that it will not be long until the initial lot will be forwarded to the smelter. The tunnel has been h ore all the way from the starting point and is headed towards a big iron blow out which shows on the surface about 50 feet ahead and where the management will be disappointed if some fine pay ore is not encountered. The company is making preparations to develop the Empire vein across the canyon and counts on getting some good results there.

NEVADA CONSOLIDATED.

Ely Mine Making a Splendid Account Of Itself, Says Walker.

"Nevada Consolidated is understood

Of Itself, Says Walker. "Nevada Consolidated is understood to be making a very gratifying show-ing," says George L. Walker in the Boston Commercial. "I understand that the Steptoe Smelling company, which is owned by and treats the ore of the Nevada Consolidated and Cum-berland Ely, is already putting out at the rate of 10,000,000 pounds of copper annually. Operations to date have demonstrated conclusively that Nevada Consolidated will secure a re-covery of 70 per cent of all the cop-per in its 2 to 2% per cent ore. This means that it will yield from 28 to 30 pounds of fine copper to the ton. "It is figured that when the three sections of the Steptoe concentrator so far practically completed are in operation, Nevada Consolidated will be able to produce 25,000,000 pounds of copper annually, and that its out-put will be increased to 50,000,000 pounds by the end of next year. "Cumberland Ely is putting out 700 tons of ore dally from its Veteran shaft, which is yielding about 40 pounds of copper to the ton. The as-say average of all the ore so far blocked out by this company is 3.68
