

# STREET VENGANCE.

How it Was Meted Out to Bandit  
Bennett at Busset's Ranch.

TAKEN FROM DEPUTY SHERIFF.

Wanted to Make a Confession, But Pense Would  
Not Permit It.

AND HE WAS SENT INTO ETERNITY.

Prison That Other Outlaws Will Share the  
Same Fate—Johnson Among Those  
Who Were Captured.

Rock Springs, Wyo., March 8.—The body of V. R. Hoy, murdered at Ladown canyon, by outlaws on being brought here, was immediately prepared for shipment to Fremont, Neb. James A. Hoy, a brother of the dead man arrived here last evening and 2 hours after the train had departed with the remains.

From him we learn that last Thursday the posse were pressing the gang closely. The latter were positively signaled from Bennett who stood on a hill, unknown to the posse. Bennett fired his revolver three times which was understood by the outlaws across the canyon. Pete Dawson, a deputy sheriff from this place arrested Bennett and took him to Bennett's ranch security asked. When the posse learned that Bennett had been doing they came on to Bennett's and demanded from the deputy sheriff his prisoner. The demand was refused and then the posse built up the sheriff and took from him Bennett and leading him to a gate prepared to hang him. Bennett remarked:

"Please wait while I will tell you everything."

The posse waited. "We don't want to hear anything from you; you can die with your knowledge." And he was sent into eternity.

The posse then notified the sheriff that if he wanted the shackle he had better go and unlock them as they waited to bury the dead man without further delay. Accordingly the shacks were taken off and the body buried in a shallow grave. The posse then proceeded to search for the other three men, Johnson, Ladd and a man supposed to be a Mexican and finally succeeded in getting them within twelve miles of Powder Springs where they were heading for. They were being carried by a horse and at last captured the two were taken to Vernal, Utah, and Johnson was being brought to Rock Springs by Deputy Sheriff Pete Dawson.

Bennett is expected here any moment, but it is not expected that he will have the prisoner with him. It is strongly suspected that he will overpower the sheriff and hang Johnson to the nearest tree.

Vernal, Utah, via Price, March 8.—The Vernal posse was in pursuit of the Powder Springs outlaws, returned last evening.

Bennett was lynched at the Bennett ranch at the head of the Ladown canyon. The lynching was done before the Vernal posse reached the park. There was great satisfaction expressed at the outcome of the raid here. There was a great demonstration last night.

The returning party seems to be of the opinion as to the disposition of the captured outlaws. They express the opinion, freely that they will not live to come to trial. The Brown Park ranchman is very determined. They are inclined to take up arms and will make an effort to stamp out outlawing in that section. The posse had great difficulty in procuring the brother of William Stranger from killing Johnson and avenging the murder of his brother.

Sheriff Price and Deputy Collector were to be complimented on the prompt action they took in the matter. The Vernal posse was not at the final battle, but they were using all exertions to get there that the outlaws were not to fall alive for keeping out of their way.

John Stranger was the first man in that night. He was the center of an interest group for some time. Bennett was built on the principal streets of Vernal in celebration of the event.


