

CITY COUNCIL DOINGS

The Gravity Sewer Contract Confirmed at Last Night's Meeting.

THOSE "REVISED" COMMITTEES.

Land and Water Commissioner Pendleton Submits Plans for a Sheep Route Over the Mountains.

The City Council held an adjourned session last night. The members present were: Rich, Phillips, Hardy, Kirtland, Moran, Hays, Bell, Evans, Almond, Kelly, Boardman, Wentland, Hays, Lawson. President Lombard presided over the session and the meeting was opened by him. The first business was a report from the committee on the gravity sewer contract, which was confirmed by a vote of 10 to 2.

In presenting the report, Lombard said: "I have been urged by certain members of the Council to reorganize the standing committees, and this appeared to be necessary in some of the committees. But when I began to remodel them I found that a change in use necessitated a change in others. At the last meeting I handed the reorganized list. I got it again this morning to look over and have made certain changes in it and will hand it to the recorder again this evening with the committees arranged as I think they should be. I desire that the members shall examine it by next Tuesday evening as I want it satisfactory. I have made the most important committee consist of five members, in order that all projects can be represented."

KIRKBY'S CUPPER PLANT ADDITION.
The city engineer reported that plans of Kirby's copper plant addition had been filed in his office and he asked for instructions regarding approval of the same. The engineer was authorized to approve the plans.

SEWERAGE ESTIMATES.
The city engineer reported that the estimated cost of constructing a sewer from the city hall to the east side of Second Street from Fourth to Fifth North streets in district No. 22 is as follows:

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MONEY FOR THE U. P.
City Auditor Raybould sent in a communication in which he recommended that an appropriation of \$5,120.16 be made to meet the second and third payments on the land purchased in the land of City Creek canyon from the Union Pacific. Adopted.

ACCESSIBLE ROADWAY.
Land and Water Commissioner Pendleton reported that in the matter of the petition of the Utah Freedmen and the company, proposing to buy or lease certain lands from the city, the issue should be so drawn that the water and roadway passing through the lands accessible to the city. Laid on the table temporarily.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.
The city auditor's report for the month of April, as published in the News some days ago, was read and referred to the committee on finance.

POLICE JURY'S REPORT.
The report of Police Justice Goss for the month of April was read and referred to the committee on police.

STREET CLOSING-WALKS.
The board of public works sent in a communication asking for instructions relative to street-closing over the portion of streets to be paved by the street railways. The Council having previously instructed them to allow to go only from the curb to the edge of the sidewalk from the sidewalk blocks. Referred back to the board with power to act.

GRAVITY SEWER CONTRACT.
The board of public works reported that they had entered into a contract with the firm of Houshagen, Griffith, Morris, Houshagen and Williamson of the city for the work of constructing the

gravity sewer of the combination sewer and brick masonry, about 11,435 feet and that they had secured a bond of \$100,000 to ensure the proper performance of the work by December the 1st next, with George M. Cannon, Francis Armstrong, John H. White and Wm. H. Howe as securities.

The contract covered several pages of closely printed matter and required three-quarters of an hour to read. The action of the board was confirmed and the contract referred to the Mayor for his approval.

WATER WALKS.
The city engineer reported that he was appointed by the mayor to act on a joint committee with members of the county court and Sheep Owners' Association to locate a route for sheep walks pasturable with regard to interests concerned in such.

We have agreed upon a route by way of the mountain and upper reaches into Emigration canyon and from this expense is necessary to make it of the most possible approach to the water of the city. The route has been put in a bridge at this end and others are necessary of the trip should be started in the morning and the route would carry the trail away from the creek. This route avoids the heavy and congested water ways, as it enters Parley's about seven miles above.

I would recommend that this work be ordered done, as the sheep are now moving east and the matter needs immediate attention. Referred to the superintendent of waterworks and land and water commissioner.

SEWER WATER.
The city engineer stated that he believed it would be an advantage to the city in the work of constructing the gravity sewer to have it understood that contractors for this work could use water from the pipe system free of cost, and recommended that the council pass a resolution authorizing the same and it was so ordered. Referred to the superintendent of waterworks.

WANTS TO GET HIM.
Superintendent of Waterworks Ryan sent in a communication in which he requested that the Council authorize J. H. O'Leary to report to him that a Frank Anderson had entered a right of way of land in City Creek canyon, and that he would build a house thereat once unless prevented from doing so; that the city has purchased considerable land in this canyon to protect the water supply from any pollution and he suggested that the city serve an injunction on Mr. Anderson, without delay. City engineer and watermaster.

JENKINS' DAM.
In the matter of the petition of J. H. Jensen relative to a dam being constructed across City Creek which he claimed endangered his property, the city engineer reported that the dam would in no way endanger petitioner's property, and thought it unnecessary to protect petitioner's interests by a dam wall, as asked for. Adopted.

FIVE SANITARY INSPECTORS.
The committee on sanitary rules and quarantine regulations reported recommending that five sanitary inspectors be appointed to serve at pleasure of the Council at a salary of \$3 per day to be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the Council. Referred back to the committee with power to act.

EIGHTEEN EAST STREET EXTENSION.
The committee on streets recommended that Eighteenth East Street be opened as far south as Eleventh South street. Committee on public grounds with instructions to report promptly.

WHITE HOUSE PAYMENT.
The same committee reported similarly on the laying of pavements to the Jennings house, on First South street. Adopted.

LOWER SEVEN THE CUTTER.
The watermaster sent in a report stating that when the street was paved the connections that delivered the water from the Jordan canal to the irrigation ditch at Brigham street were destroyed, and so the canal is considerably lower than the head of the gutter at Brigham and Riverside, he asked that some way be provided to supply the people with irrigating water from that point. Referred to city engineer and watermaster with power to act.

SEWERAGE U. S. TRACT.
The board of public works reported that they had entered into a contract with the Pacific Electric company for the work of laying out and constructing a sewerage system on both sides of State street, between Fourth and Sixth South, and that a sufficient bond had been given in the sum of \$2000 to secure the proper performance of the work in the time stipulated. In the contract. Accompanying this report was a copy of the specifications, contract, bond and affirmation relative.

The contract was approved and referred to the mayor.

PAYING RESOLUTIONS.
Moran introduced a resolution providing that the city engineer send

board of public works be instructed to see that the paving on Main and First and Second South streets be proceeded with such despatch as will insure the completion within the time named in the contract, and that the operations of the contract shall be confined to such portions of the streets as will not disable the business of the entire district to be paved, and that, on failing, he allowed until the contractors are prepared to complete that portion of the work promptly. Adopted.

APPROPRIATION.
Appropriation was made amounting to \$5,000, after which the Council adjourned until Tuesday night next.
