#### MILITARY.

HEAD QUARTERS NAUVOO LEGION, ) ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE, U. T., > G. S. L. City, April 23, 1866.

GENERAL ORDERS NO. 1.

I.-Major Generals are hereby authorized to appoint an additional aide-de-camp on their respective Staffs, with the rank of Colonel of Light Artillery.


II.-Brigadier Generals are hereby authorized to appoint two additional aides-de-camp on their respective Staffs, one with the rank of Colonel of Infantry, and one with the rank of Captain of Cavalry.

III.-Each Regiment of the Legion, where not previously done, will, immediately on receipt of these orders, proceed to elect a Lieutenant Colonel, under the direction of their respective districts.

IV.-It is recommended that all commissioned officers, at proper times, wear the insigna of rank conforming with the U.S. Regulations, and each Company, Battalion, or Regiment, will adopt some suitable uniform, the character of which they will themselves determine.

V.-Commandants of Districts will cause a due proportion of the militia of each settlement to be organized as Cavalry.

VI.-Special Orders No. 1, March 26th, 1862, detaching Captain Jack's command as an Independent Rifle Company, is hereby counteraress manded, and he will report to Colonel A. L. Fullmer, 1st Regiment, 2d Brigade, Infantry, Salt Lake Military District, for service in his 8w-15sw1 Regiment. VII.-Major General R. T. Burton, commanding Salt Lake Military District, will cause to be TAKE NOTICE organized in his district two companies of Sharp-shooters and one of Sappers and Miners, and assign them to service in such corps as he may deem proper. VIII.-The Battalion of Artillery under command of Major S. G. Ladd is hereby attached to the Salt Lake Military District, and he will report to Major General R. T. Burton. IX.-The Counties of Utah and Cedar will hereafter constitute a Military District, and Brigadier General Aaron Johnson, with Colonels W. B. Pace and W. Chipman, will proceed to organize the same into a Division, hold an election, and fill all offices necessary to complete the organization of said Division. X.-The portion of Iron County lying east of the Wasatch range of mountains, together with Pi-Ute and Sevier Counties, will hereafter constitute a separate Military District, and Major Jesse N. Smith of the Iron Military District is hereby assigned to the duty of organizing the same. XI.-The County of Wasatch will hereafter constitute a separate Military District, to be commanded by Major John Witt, who will, upon the receipt of these orders, hold a muster and inspection of arms, hold an election and fill the necessary offices. XII.-Major Lott Smith, of 1st Regiment, 1st Brigade, of Cavalry, Salt Lake Military District, is hereby assigned to duty in the Davis Military District, and, with Colonel Merrill, will proceed to organize the Militia of said District into a Brigade, hold an election and fill all offices necessary to complete said organization. XIII.-The resignation of Colonel D. Moore, of Weber Military District, is hereby accepted, and Brigadier General C. W. West will order an election, and fill said vacancy, and all others that exist in his Brigade. XIV .- The County of Richland is hereby created a Military District, and General C. C. Rich is hereby authorized and requested to hold an election and fill all offices necessary to complete the organization thereof. XV.-Brigades will number in the order of their organization in their respective Districts.


