INSPECTING STEAMSHIPS.

INSPECTING STEAMSHIPS. San Poiro, Cal., Sopt. 6.—The United States government is compelling rigid inspection of steamships entering this port, with a view of proventing the spread of the pleagueat points along the southern coast. Dr. W. A. Weldon, ma-rime surgeon of this port, acting under instructions from Washington today, turned back the Rosnoke, as she was entering the harbor and compelled her to come to anchor in the outside har-bor. He conducted a thorough luspec-tion of the vessel and ordered a clean-ing out of the rate in the lower hold. The Roanoke was then given a clean bill of health. Every vessel, large and small, is being rigidly hospected. Not only are the rate closely scrutinized, but the fleas on them are being looked out for.
