with Secretary Teller's order dated Marck 3d, the Commissioner (General d-9 11 of the Land Office issued three patents to the New Orleans Pacific Railroad Combany for 679,287 acres of land known as the "Backbone" grant), and

March 10th, 1885. You are hereby directed to suspend all proceedings relative to patenting lands to the New Orleans Pacific Hallroad Company until further notice. Signed, L. Q. C. LAMAR.

In addition to the lands already patented, the New Orleans Pacific Railroad Company has lists covering 326,706 acres, which, under this last order, cannot be patented until the Secretary takes further action.
