The Paris Exposition Commission.

The World says McCornick, the United States Commissioner General to the Paris Exposition, is very busy engaged in making preliminary arrangements for the proper representation of American industries.

He said, yesterday, that he is now occupied in selecting from a large number of applicants for permits to exhibit those whose applications may be rejected by reason of the very limited space allotted to the United States.

McCornick says the bureau is overrun with agricultural machines, more than there will be space for, and more than there is any excuse for exhibiting. Experts are now busy selecting the machines most worthy of exhibition, and these only will be accepted. The list of exhibitors cannot be made up until all the applications for space have been passed upon and the privileges at the disposal of the bureau equally apportioned. The commission has appointed a committee to inquire into and report upon the feasibility of making an exhibit of American art.

Washington, 10.—Over 40 Senators were in the chamber before the Senate was called to order, at noon.

A great part of the morning was taken up in the presentation of a large number of petitions from various parts of the country in favor of the adoption of a 10th amendment, prohibiting the States from discriminating between persons of different colors in the right of suffrage.

A large number of bills were introduced and referred to appropriate committees, among them the following:

By Mr. Sherman, to regulate Chinese immigration.

By Mr. Sherman, supplementary to the act of March 3, 1877, in relation to the Hot Springs reservation in Arkansas.

By Mr. Sherman, to re-organize the pay department of the army.

By Mr. Sherman, to extend the provisions of the act of 1874 in relation to money to all field officers.

By Mr. Sherman, authorizing mail routes between New Orleans and Mexico, between New Orleans and certain parts of the republic of Mexico.

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
