PURGE THE REGISTRATION LISTS

IF the managers of the "Liberal" organization really desire a fair election next February, they will unite with the leaders of the People's Party in a genuine effort to purge the registration lists of the names of all dead, removed or otherwise disqualified persons, that none may appear thereon but of those who are lawfully entitled to vote at the municipal election.

There are hundreds of names which have no business to be there. Some of them are of persons who were members of the People's Party when they were in the city. Many more of them are of "Liberal." We believe they have been retained for a specific purpose, and that an unlawful one. We have reason to think this because it was by such means that the wholesale frauds at the Ogden City election were made possible, frauds which have been openly boasted of by the "Liberals" who helped in them and uttered here and in Washington.

The registration officers -- the deputies, did not all perform their duty at the last revision. They did not visit the house of each resident in their precincts, that persons newly qualified could register, neither did they make diligent inquiry so that persons who had died, or removed, or otherwise become disqualified might be stricken from the lists. Some of them were excessively active in registering "Liberal" citizens and in avoiding People's Party citizens. But gross negligence was displayed in the matter of erasures.

There are gentlemen of honor fairness and good reputation in the "Liberal" party who ought to be interested in the purity of elections as much as the People's Party. We ask them now to aid in the work that ought to be done, and to take steps as soon as possible to have the registration lists purged, and thus prepare the way for a fair and honorable contest next February.

This may be done without attempting to urge the Utah Commission to do something which they have no legal authority to perform. Such action would be but a vain pretence of fairness, a "Liberal" sham, a mockery of political virtue. Let gentlemen of all shades of opinion unite in paving the way for a genuine test of legal voting strength in this city, and after a fair contest we will not only acquiesce in the result but do our best to support

efforts to govern the municipality. whatever may be their politics.

All we protest against is fraud and attempted fraud, by which the lawful majority may be robbed of their rights. We know this was done at Ogden, we know it is contemplated here. Let the nefarious methods resorted to in the Ogden case be rendered impossible in this city, and let all fair and just persons unite to make them so.

THE WEATHER.

THE question as to whether a warm summer follows an open winter is agitating a portion of the eastern press. It takes very little to produce an agitation and still less a discussion nowadays. Those who have kept track of the characteristics of the seasons for only a few years past can settle the question without any further controversy. Last winter was not an open one, to a great extent, and this is the hottest summer any living person ever saw, at least in the United States. The winter before was noted for its severity, the thermometer at times indicating from five to forty degrees below zero in elevated parts of Utah, and much more in other localities to the north and east. It will also be remembered that last summer was one of the pleasantest, especially of evenings, which the oldest inhabitant ever experienced.
