A SALT LAKE GHOST STORY.

Weird Tale of an Alleged Haunted Church in this City.

The Clergy Preacher Herman and the Fox of His Master Victim Rehearsed in Denver.

Denver, Sept. 10. The Scandinavian Methodist church pastor, which thrilled the people of Salt Lake with its horrors some time ago, again weighs heavily on their minds because of the singular resemblance it bears to the spirit of the murdered wife, Henrietta Closson and Anna Fannison. O. M. Ramsey, a Salt Lake man, staying at the Albany, tells the story of the ghostly apparitions in some detail yesterday.

"All of you have heard of the double murder committed by the pastor Herman in the basement of a Salt Lake church, haven't you?" inquired Mr. Ramsey, by way of introduction.

"Well, the case was published when all the world over, and the minister, exonerated the widow of Herman, exonerated the two women, and exonerated them both in the church's eyes. The pastor has attached himself to a wing occupied by widows, who he calls the choir of the church, for starting their case. The crime was committed in the basement of the church, and the pastor, with his people left, a few weeks ago the Justice of the Peace again brought to the attention of the public by the papers that there were instances every night of the ghosts of the murdered women. They are all Henrietta wives and were buried at the same time, buried in the same plot, buried in the same grave, and buried in the same church they left."

The long circuit that has been visited by the spirit of the murdered women now seems to be breaking away, and again the catastrophe will be repeated.
