SEVENTH SCHOOL WORK AND WORKERS.

The effectiveness and great variety of the labor performed in the Sunday schools of the Latter-day Saints in training the young people in an understanding of the principles of the Gospel is a source of the deepest gratification to those who love to see the rising generation firmly established in the principles and practice of righteousness.

Realizing as we the labor of the Sunday schools in conveying an understanding of the principles of truth to the people who attend and the teachers who take part, there is still one reason for special satisfaction in connection with such efforts. It is that the Sabbath schools are institutions in religion, not in theology alone.

Notwithstanding the student heart shown by the scholars, the most commendable feature of the instruction was the order and discipline observed in the classes, and the thoroughness with which the lessons were studied.

THE UNIVERSITY OF UTAH.

The forty-sixth year in the history of the University of Utah will open before the close of another week. The calendar announcements set September 15th as the opening day for entrance examinations.

The instructing force now numbers twenty-three professors and instructors, twenty of the training school corps. The additions and changes since the close of the last year are as follows: Richard R. Lyman, B. S., a graduate from the University of Michigan.

The normal school work, by its arrangement of a clear line of distinction will be drawn between the training of the college students and that of the high school pupils. The training school which, heretofore, was conducted in the basement of the city board of education, in the Fremont school building, is now installed under the roof of the normal school structure.

The normal school paper will be conducted as heretofore as a department of the University. The building has been thoroughly renovated; extensive additions and alterations have transformed the structure into one of the most commodious, convenient, healthful and well equipped buildings in our first initial school progress in the country.

A gymnasium now has been established for the first time in connection with the University. An extensive equipment of apparatus of the very best construction has been prepared from the stock, and this addition to the institution's equipment promises results of the highest order.

The main building will give room to the biological and mineralogical laboratories, the museum, the library, and numerous class rooms and offices. The News is pleased to note that the position of the University as the head of the public school system of the State, which has been declared by law to be its heritage, is now more thoroughly recognized than ever.
