OPSONIC TREATMENT FOR LOWER ANIMALS

Fort Collins, Colo, Oct 35.-What is known as the opsonic breatment dis-covered in England several years ago and successfully applied to humans un combatting germ diseases is now be-ing used with equal seuccess in treating lower animals. The veterinary depart-ment of the Colorado agricultural col-lege has successfully demonstrated, it is said, that horses, cattle and shoep, suffering from afflictions accompanied by suppuration are reached by the op-conic method. The discovery was made 30 days ago, but kept secret, by Dr. B. P. Kaupp, pathologist, and Prof. G. W. New York, Oct. 25.-Rarely, If ev r. has Carnegie hall seen such a gath iing of women as assembled there to night under the direction of the Equality League of Self-Supporting Women, to welcome Mrs. Enumeine Pankhurst, British militant suffin ette, and to proclaim their own right to Aute.

On the stage were 79 teachers, 57 physicians, six dontists, 49 social work-ers, 35 trained nurses, 126 trade union-lats, eight actresses, including Miss Carlotta Neilson and Mrs Beatrice Forbes Robertson; 10 musicians, Miss Anna Peck, the mountain cliniber; four civil engineers, 46 business women, 15 authors, including Charlotte Perkins Gilman and Countess de Grasmont, three sculptors, one architect, four Gliman and Countess de Grammoni, three sculptors, one architect, four journalists, including Mrs. Elbert Hub-bard; 16 civil service women, 25 law-yers and representatives of 12 trades in which women compste with men. Among the boxnoiders were Mrs. O H. P. Belmont, Mrs. J. G. Fhelre Stokes, Mrs. William M. Ivins. Mrs. E. E. Pary and Mrs. Henry Phipps.
