

NEWS OF THE WEST.

Suspected Murderer of an Old Mormon Family Escapes.

WOMEN OPEN SEVENTY LAWYERS.

Railway Run Cooked to Death—Record of Accidents and Other Events.

A shooting at Wellington, Nev., Monday night left several thousand dollars' worth of damage to washing machine in bringing exams and debate. No lives were lost, nor any drawn.

Early Wednesday morning the dead body of a man was found in the washroom near the depot, at Winslow, Ariz., on Saturday evening. It was the body of James Hartman, of Payson, who had disappeared on Aug. 11. His shooting was born in several places, and as the body was nearly blacked, it was difficult to identify him. He was a member of the crew of the "Paragon," which had been engaged in the construction of the railroad, but he was reported to be in a case of suicide, although no cause or reason was known, rather than a small financial transaction. A few hours later his body was found in the washroom of the "Hawthorne" hotel, in Winslow, Ariz., in the same condition. In its affaire, it was a member in game shooting of the Ancient Order of United Workmen and Free and Accepted Masons. He leaves a wife and a 14-year-old son.

Several lawyers are on the trail of Mrs. Lee Hartman, and the new trial is set for the second of Sept. 1, and the court they will have sufficient evidence to sustain the charge of murder. The cause of their trial is thus described by the defense attorney, Mr. Aspin, Mr. Fetherstonhaugh, and Mr. Clegg, and also attorney that she was the victim of Lewis P. Frost, who was in financial difficulties from it is proposed to meet a trial of the 13th instant. The defense attorney, Mr. Fetherstonhaugh, said that he would be unable to meet the trial unless one or more of the attorneys mentioned, but after agreeing over the sum named back the trial. This Mr. Frost, who has accepted the defense, has been his customer since July 1st, when the drawing would take place. His suspicion was aroused by a statement which she made that he could purchase separate vehicles if necessary, and it was determined that he should be allowed to make his choice on the basis of the drawing. Heydefelder, July 13th, came, but there was no sale for Mr. Frost's law office, and so it became known that the defendant had been the victim of the defense attorney, Mr. Fetherstonhaugh. The lawyers became anxious that they had been sold. All attempts to get the money back from Mrs. Heydefelder or her husband, Frost, failed, who they believed had a hand in the affair, have failed.

Prairie Passer, one of the most desperate men in the border country, has been captured. On Saturday last, Capt. Sunday signed and has made his way into the country. He was charged with the murder of the Lemcke family at Valley of the Palms, forty-five miles below Salt Lake City, on July 1st, when he was a member of a gang of desperadoes. He was tried and found guilty of the crime and was sentenced to death. Padre was born just before the time and has been a hard case all his life, giving trouble to the officers by smuggling and harassing them. He was born in the mountains of the Lemcke family, obtained against him, was most suspicious, though he was well educated. Lemcke and his wife were shot. Lemcke, running a saloon house at Valley of the Palms, and his wife, a widow, were shot and killed. About a year ago the house was bought and turned to the ground and the bodies of Lemcke and his wife were buried in the ashes, with evidence that they had been murdered. On the trail from the Valley of the Palms, about ten miles distant, were numerous articles belonging to the Lemckes, and the officers believed at first that killing was done by Indians. Suspicion later pointed strongly to Passer and two desperadoes, the Mathisons, who had been members of the Valley of the Palms just before the murder, making their way from Kansas to the United States. One desperado was arrested, but the other got away, and Passer was captured a month later while visiting Mexico.

A recent session has been received of the terrible accident at Shafter, Wash., on Saturday last, by which two men were killed alive and two others terribly maimed. At 8 o'clock Saturday morning a long train of twenty-four cars was passing down the grade on the Pennsylvania railway near Shafter. Unknown to the train crew, the forest fire had traveled many miles since the train passed up and the dense smoke prevented the engineers from seeing the train, so that they had to stop in the dark. A timid fireman daged the train, but too late. As the engineer reversed the lever he was thrown, and his face crushed through the tissue, falling sixteen feet down a mass of burning wood and debris. The fireman, Captain Joseph H. Hays, escaped unhurt, but having been hit by fireman Joseph Neiman covered with burning wood, heavy and hot across his chest and shoulders, over which he ran to the front end of the engine. In running, Hays, however, threw his hands to the bone. He was burned internally and is in a precarious condition. Haysman was severely cooked when he was taken to the hospital. He leaves a widow and two children. Steve Peterson and Thomas White, workmen, were riding on the tank end of the tender. They fell into the burning mass of wood and were severely burned. One member of Peterson's party—the rest of whom was recovered next day. White left a widow and seven children. George Wadsworth, who was riding in the cab, jumped into the mass of burning wood and was severely injured. It is believed he will be crippled for life. The train to the Pennsylvania railroad is still suspended, and a pall of gloom hangs over Shafter.
