MAN ACCUSED IS NOW DEAD.

says she Heard Shot Fired, Saw Man Who Fired it and Heard Him Boast of Deed.

Richmond, Ind. Spt. 21 .- Turner igo of Farmers, Rowan county, Ky., charged with the killing of Gov. William Goebel of Kentucky, in an affidavit by Mrs. Lulu Clark, which was published exclusively today by the Richmond Evening Item. The affidavit was sworn to last April in the law offlors of ex-Gov. W. S. Taylor of Kenhicky. Mrs. Clark, whose maiden was Lulu Williams, lived at the time of the Goobel murder at Mt. Sterling, Ky, She has a cousin named Germids King, who then lived at Mays-

Ing, Ky. She has a coust named Ger-tride King, who then lived at Mays-ville, Ky. Miss King was at that time accord-ing to the affidavit "keeping company" with John Sanford of Covington Ky., a sen of an altorney who was killed by William Goebel in a fight in Covington some years ago. The fight was the re-sult of a political quarrel. Mrs. Clark swears that on the day Goebel was murdered she and her comm. Miss King, went to Frankfort. Ky. and that they started to enter the house by the rear entrance. While on the steps a shot was fired. At the same time they noticed a man stand-ing just inside the door, whom they recognized as Sanford. In a minute, a second man came running out of the building, dressed like a mountaineer and carrying a rifle. He ran to San-ford and said: "I got the d-d "The man was recognized by the affant as her friend, Turner Iso of Farmers, Rowan county Ky. Both men ran out of the building to a face, where Sanford gave a pair of shoes he was carrying to Igo, who ex-changed his boots for them. The men then disappeared. The affant states that Iso told her at the Mit Sterling depot on Jan. 25. 1906, that he was going to kill Goebel, and that she saw him afterward at Jeffersonville, Ind., and that he re-minded her that he had fuifilled his promise.

omise. She also says that Sanford had told Gertrude King a few days prior to Goebel's murder that he intended to kill Goebel, saying. "Here is my chance to get revenge. The legislature has met."

JOHN SANFORD. Cinclinati, O., Sept. 21.-The John sanford mentioned in the Richmond, Ind., dispatch, is the son of the late Atty. Sanford who was shot by William Gobel. Gobel was acquitted, but young Sanford was many times quoted as threatening to "get even," and has been subjected of the murder, although direct evidence was lacking. His moth-er, wife of the dead man, is at present in a sanitarium, her mind having giv-on way under the strain. Young San-ford has not been at home for about two years. He is understood to have going to China, and is now somewhere in the far enst.

It was written on a letterhead of "Frank Covington, Fuel. Feed and Hauling, St. Paul, Minn.," and was signed "Edith." It bears date of April 11, 1905, and was enclosed in a worn and unaddressed envelope. It was written to Frank Covington. The oth-er letter had no significance, so far as could be deciphered. The police have no theory as to the murder, though they are inclined to the belief that the trunk was thrown into the sound from a boat. It was weighed with rocks, but the murderer did not weigh it sufficiently to pre-vent it from floating. Essen, Germany, Sept. 21.—The temperance question was again dis-oussed today at the Socialistic national convention in this city. Only one vote was cast against a resolution whose
