### EVENING NEWS.

Friday, June 29, 1882.

#### BY TELEGRAPH.

##### FOREIGN.

**The Fleet Thickens.**

ALEXANDRIA, 29.—Information has just been received that important events are impending. The people who have hitherto intended staying here on account of vital interests in Egypt are now hurrying away. Last night a council was held for taking into consideration the question of hostilities. The selection of Englishmen being advocated. The natives seem to be certain that discussions have arisen in the conference on account of some powers that are unable to agree with them. Whether this is true or not the consequences for the movement are disastrous to the prestige of England and France. Preparations are being made on a large scale to block the Suez Canal. Much dissatisfaction is felt about the Galatz at the order to proceed to Gibraltar without calling for stores at Nice, as the officers have suffered enormously through having redoubts on board, and look upon the order as bearing the brunt of the work, as an injustice.

**Sentenced.**

ODESSA, 29.—In the District Court at Terrapoli the following were sentenced to deprivation of civil rights and transportation for a term of years, three anti-Semites who killed one Jew and severely wounded several others during the riots at Dubossary.

**Warlike.**

LONDON, 29.—The Times says: In view of the information we have received from various quarters, we cannot doubt that preparations for the protection of the Suez Canal are maturing on a considerable scale. We have reason to believe that the first army corps, and a considerable part of the second are at full strength, and should it be necessary to strike a sudden blow, there will be no difficulty in dispatching 20,000 troops to Egypt in a few days.

The Egyptian unified stock has fallen 15 per cent. since the last stock exchange settlement.

**Carrying the War into Africa.**

The steamer Stanley, which will leave Woolwich for Malta on Friday will take field hospitals, cavalry equipments, submarine miners and a portion of the portable railway. It is understood that two militia regiments of London district will not be dismissed after training but will be retained for service in Africa, and the possibility of two battalions of the guard being sent to the Mediterranean.

**The Italian Fleet.**

ROME, 29.—It is stated that the Admiral and Commander of the Italian fleet has been ordered to cruise within easy distance of Alexandria, so that he can be promptly summoned in case of necessity.

**Thirty-Six Men-of-War.**

ALEXANDRIA, 29.—There are now thirty-two men-of-war in the harbor of Alexandria and four more expected.

There are symptoms of a rising here yesterday, directed against the English. The soldiers cleared the square and the guard has been doubled.

LONDON, 29.—It is stated that a regiment of the 1st Buffs, and two battalions of infantry at Aldershot have been warned to be prepared to go to the Mediterranean.

### BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

Corking, yesterday, gave Arthur one of the "303" medals.

The New Orleans case of yellow fever has created much excitement.

The democrats at Rockville, Illinois, nominated John E. Lamb, for Congress.

The great Masonic parade at Louisville, attracts thousands of strangers.

Five men were drowned in the Upper Missouri River, in Mandan Mountain, in an upsetting boat.

The naval board recommends the appropriation of \$25,000 for the removal of the remains of DeLong and companions to their homes.

General Beal, Grant's minister to Austria, is out in a card announcing himself a candidate for Congress from the Fifth Maryland District.

The approaching execution has brought a number of "cranks" here from various parts of the country and the police are instructed to watch them.

At Ration, N. M., after Gus Mentzel, the sanguinary gambler, had been lynched, as previously reported the crowd took his pal, C. D. R. Bradley, and hanged him.

The republicans say that yesterday's democratic resolutions are strong ones and will compel the republicans in Pennsylvania to dispose of disensions or suffer defeat.

In Lagrimore, D. T., a fire in the heart of town yesterday morning, did \$50,000 worth of damage, and is spreading rapidly. It is reported that several persons are burned to death.

In Washington, Charles H. French filed a suit in equity against John W. Dorsey, John R. Miner and Harvey M. Valle, for the recovery of an account. The suit is in the U. S. District Court at Chicago.

At Havana, Ill., two men named Graham and Noland, quarreled. Graham threw a hatchet, cutting the artery in Noland's neck and cheek. Noland simultaneously struck Graham on the head with an axe. Both will die.

The officials at the White House are constantly on the lookout and have been notified of the presence of a number of persons for whom admission has been refused. No apprehension is felt for the safety of the President, yet without proper care there might be danger.

At Harrisburg, the democratic convention met at 10:15. Chauncey P. Black was nominated for Lieutenant Governor on the first ballot. George H. Irwin getting 734, and Black 175; Judge S. M. Clark was re-nominated for the Supreme Court and J. Sampson for secretary of internal affairs.

At Elizabethtown, Ill., Monday evening, a young colored man, supposed to be the one who had struck a woman in the face for interfering to prevent him entering a house with burglarious intent, was hung by a mob after being brutally beaten. He is now believed to have been innocent.
